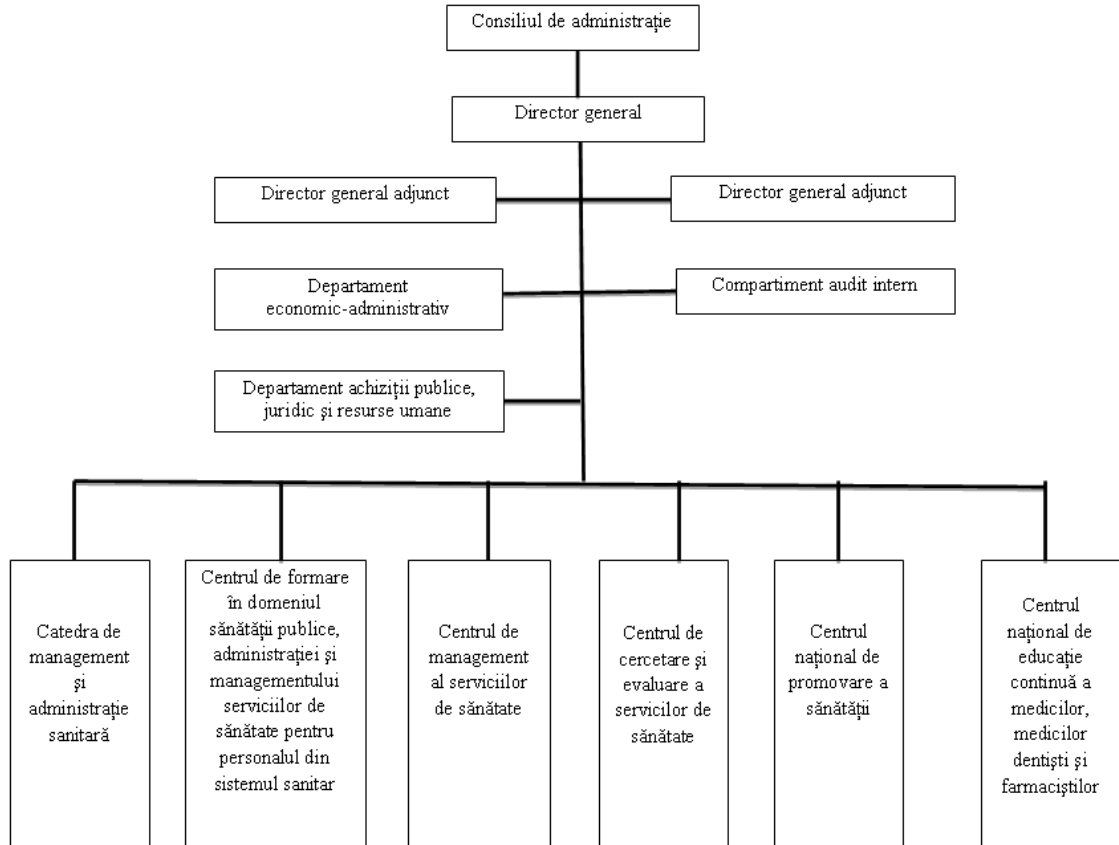
- Improve the quality of training programs for medical staff, managers and decision makers, in accordance with beneficiary's requirements and diversify training offers each year.

The general organization of the institution (Organizational Chart)

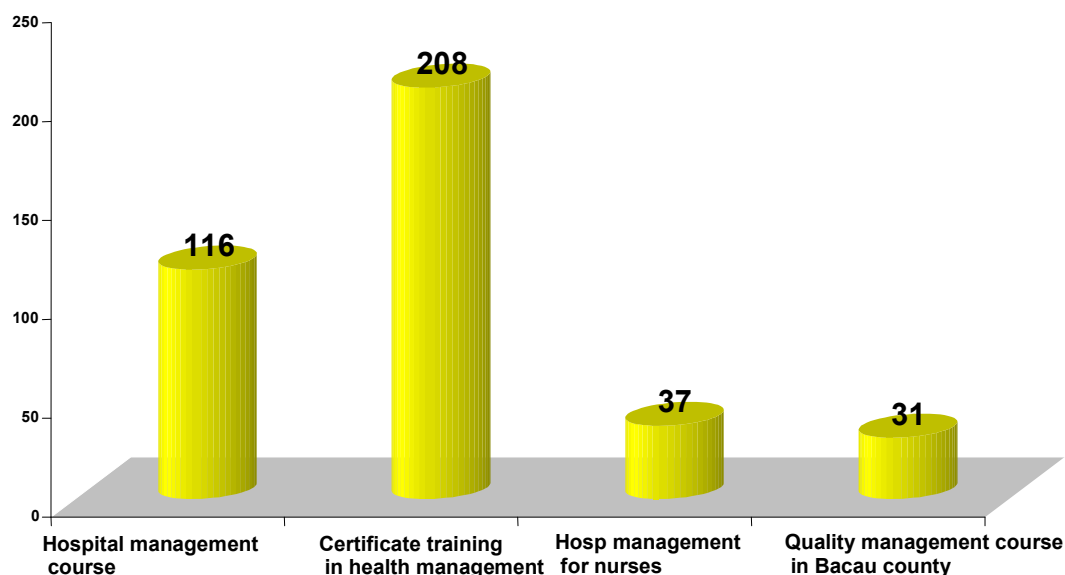


I Training Programs

1. Courses conducted by Postgraduate Training Center in Public Health, Health Services Administration and Management. Total number of students was 392 and their distribution by type of course is presented in chart. 1.

A. Training course in Hospital Management

This course is organized in accordance with Minister of Health order number 168 in 2007 amending the Minister of Health order number 635 in 2006 regarding the approval for organizing the hospital management course, necessary to fill the position of manager in a public hospital.

Course goal is to provide training for hospital managers in terms of an efficient hospital management.

The course is divided into 7 modules and is aimed at postgraduates of medical specialties, legal, economic and administrative ones.

During 2011, the Training Center organized and conducted **4 Hospital Management courses**. **The total number of participants in this course was 116**. The proportion of physicians who participated in this course is declining compared to 2010 (53% in 2010, 43% in 2011), this fact is showing an

increased interest of other specialists in the management of the hospital, than those who were medically trained.

B. Certificate training program in Health Services Management

The program **aims** acquiring knowledge and skills in public health and health services management, in order to improve manager's actions in hospital units. The course lasts for 12 weeks, it has a modular structure, with 12 modules, and it mainly addresses to doctors willing to occupy a leading position in a health institution. During 2011, the program has been organized **6 times**, 3 series in Bucharest and one in Timisoara, Oradea and Braila. The total number of participants that were trained was **208**. The number of participants in this course increased by 84% compared to 2010.

C. Training course in Hospital Management for hospital nursing staff

The course' **goal** is to provide training for nurses / midwives who are willing to fill the position of health care services director or chief assistant. It's a modular course and it's structured over four weeks, as follows: organizational and financial hospital management, human resources management, hospital care quality management, healthcare legislation and communication.

During 2011, **2 courses** of this type were conducted.

D. Courses on specific topics for Public Health County Departments.

These courses aim to update knowledge of public health and health services management in order to increase performance when carrying out the evaluation and monitoring of health services in the ascribed county area, for the staff working in health departments. Courses lasts for five days and takes place at the Public Health County Departments request. In 2011a course on "Quality Management" was held in the Public Health County Departments Bacau. This course involved a total of 31 students.

2. Training programs in community healthcare conducted by the National Center for Health Promotion in the project "Promoting social inclusion by developing human and institutional resources in community healthcare assistance". The courses were organized in 10 counties in Western and Central regions. **488 students** were trained from among community nurses, health visitors and social workers Romme, employees in the city halls of towns of the 10 counties included in the project. Distribution by county of participants in these courses is presented in Table no. 1.

3. DRG' courses supported by the Centre for Research and Evaluation of Health Systems. The courses are aimed at increasing the quality of coding and reporting of the hospital's clinical activity in DRG system. In 2011 two courses were organized:

- **The analysis of hospital activity and coding standards** offered to County Emergency Hospital in Vaslui where they were trained a total of **87 students**.

- **The course Basic and advanced concepts on classification and coding of hospital activity** organized for the Institute of Pneumology "Marius Nasta" Bucharest, where **65 students** participated.

4. Training programs organized by the National Center for Continuing Education of Physicians, Pharmacists and Dental practitioners (NCCEPPDP)

During 2011, the **NCCEPPDP** organized 174 programs, having a total of 4765 participants as follows:

A. 107 Continuous Medical Education programs for physicians, dentists, pharmacists and other personnel with university degree working in the health system, on the following topics:

- Medical and surgical emergencies

- Cervico-vaginal cytology
- Obesity screening
- Promoting breastfeeding
- Radiological Protection
- Communication between doctor and patient
- Training of school network physicians and family doctors for overweight and obesity screening in school children
- Elements of manual therapy, soft tissue mobilization techniques
- Theoretical principles and clinical elements of Ayurveda traditional medicine
- Ensuring the free movement of workers and interoperability of health indicators in the EU Member States
- The role of health professionals regarding social integration of disabled children
- Minimum and non invasive treatment for face and neck rejuvenation, guidance, products and equipment, basic techniques and management of complications

Total number of participants: 3525 (twice more than in 2010, when the total number of participants was 1600 participants).

B. 60 training programs in order to obtain the certificate of Complementary studies for doctors, dentists and pharmacists in the following areas: pre-hospital emergency care, palliative care, bronchial endoscopy, general ultrasound, gynecological laparoscopic surgery, Pedodontics, Implantology, acupuncture, homeopathy, phytotherapy.

Number of participants: 1140 (50% more than in 2010, when they were prepared to obtain the certificate 760 people).

C. 7 Training Trainers programs for doctors, dentists, pharmacists and other personnel with university degree working in the health system, in the following areas: palliative care, family medicine, identification of risk factors in the prevention of noncommunicable diseases.

Number of participants: 80

5. Programs organized by the National Center for Professional Development of Generalist Nurses, the Nurses, Midwives and other assimilated staff

In 2011, NCPDGNNMOAS organized and conducted for nurses, ambulance, operators / registrars, opticians / optometrists and nurses, continuing education programs for a number of 2125 students. (See Table 2.)

VI. Dissemination of research results

1. Editing the journal "Management in Health" and making the necessary steps in order to include it in many international databases

The journal "Management in Health" is a journal recognized for the scientific content, both nationally and internationally. Since 2010, the magazine is in the category of magazines with score B + recognition by the National Council of Research in Higher Education, being also included in international databases such as Google Scholar and Index Copernicus.

In 2011, the journal "Management in Health" was accepted also in the international database DOAJ - Directory of Open Access Journals

Also, the journal "Management in Health" has agreed to collaborate with the Elsevier India database, meaning that the Elsevier database team (India department) has access to the journal content and received approval for including the journal content in the Elsevier database.

In terms of scientific content of the journal, in comparison with the previous year, in 2011, the journal included a larger number of articles of foreign authors (the proportion of domestic articles fell below 50%), developing wider areas, and continued the series of interviews with public health and health management prominent personalities, whom are recognized as international key players in this field.
